## John Peters Humphrey 1905-1995: Child of Hampton, Citizen of the World



John Peters Humphrey was born in the village of Hampton, New Brunswick, on April 30th, 1905. His father died while John was just an infant. When he was six, he suffered serious burns as the result of an accident, which led to the amputation of his left arm. He attended Hampton Consolidated School until his mother died when he was 11 years old.

Perhaps his painful childhood was the inspiration for his lifelong compassion for his fellow man. After establishing a

career at the McGill Faculty of Law, in 1946 John was appointed the first Director of the United Nations Human Rights Division. In 1947 he was asked by Eleanor Roosevelt, the Chair of the United Nations Commission on Human Rights, to compose what was to become the original draft of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The final version was adopted by the United Nations on December 10th, 1948, and Eleanor Roosevelt stated that the Universal Declaration might well become known as "a Magna Carta for all of mankind". Today, it remains the world's most important document on human rights.

Among the many honours awarded to John Peters Humphrey were thirteen honorary doctorates from around the world, Officer of the Order of Canada, the Order of Quebec, the Saul Hayes Human Rights Award from the Canadian Jewish Congress, and, in 1988, the U.N. Human Rights Award for lifetime achievements in the field of human rights.

Since his death in 1995, John Peters Humphrey continues to be recognized. Canada Post celebrated fifty years of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1998, by issuing a stamp in his honour. On July 1st, 1998, MacLean's Magazine listed Humphrey among the "one hundred most important Canadians in history". Nelson Mandela referred to Humphrey as "the father of the modern human rights system". Heritage Canada funded an exhibit on the life and works of John Peters

Humphrey entitled Citizen of the World, which went on a cross-Canada tour, courtesy of McGill Archives.

As director of the U.N. Human Rights Division, and as founding president of the Canadian Human Rights Foundation and founder of Amnesty International Canada, Humphrey's work took him to the far corners of the world. But always, Hampton, New Brunswick, was home, and held a special place in his heart. In his diaries, edited by John Hobbins and published by McGill University Press, he wrote, "When I dream (no matter what about) the background is always Hampton." He chose to have his final resting place in the Humphrey family plot in Hampton Rural Cemetery, just a few hundred feet across the Ossekeag Creek from his childhood home.



Inspired by a letter from Dr. Margaret Kunstler-Humphrey, John Humphrey's widow, The Hampton John Peters Humphrey Foundation was established and incorporated as a not-for-profit organization in 2000. The mission of the Foundation is to provide an ongoing tribute to John Peters Humphrey by educating individuals of all ages about his life and accomplishments; to provide a venue to learn about John Peters Humphrey and his work; and to educate peo-

ple about human rights issues. In June 2006, the Hampton John Peters Humphrey Foundation was selected as the recipient of the 2006 New Brunswick Human Rights Award. It recognizes outstanding effort, achievement or leadership on a volunteer basis in the promotion of human rights and equality in New Brunswick.

Hampton has community and high school groups working in support of human rights throughout the world. Peace Cranes 2000, a musical play based on the life of John Peters Humphrey, was written and produced by Hampton Elementary School teachers Anne Scott and Donna Veniot. For their efforts, the students and

staff were awarded the 2000 New Brunswick Human Rights Award. The Gift for Africa Project involved Hampton area students collecting enough toys, books, bikes and soccer balls to fill a 40 foot container for underprivileged children in South Africa. FAST BLAST is an annual fundraising Arts Weekend at Hampton High School for children's causes in third world countries. The Green Team at Hampton High School, through its recycling efforts, raises money in support of social justice initiatives. The Town and Hampton High have twinned with Piggs Peak, Swaziland, an AIDS-affected town.



In 2003, the Foundation commissioned Hooper Studios of Hampton to create a memorial to Humphrey that would be a world class work of art and which would encompass the goals of the Foundation. On June 15, 2008, that memorial was ceremoniously unveiled on the historic Kings County Courthouse lawn in the centre of Hampton. The sculpture's title, Credo, is a Latin word meaning "a set of principles or beliefs". Resting on a bed of slate, interspersed with small

patches of thyme, the memorial is multi-faceted. The colourful figures of John Humphrey as an adult and as a small boy, carved from mahogany, are sitting on a semicircular bench symbolic of the United Nations. On the bench are three bronze doves of peace. Two huge sandstone monoliths, one with several articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights carved in English, French, Mi'kmaq and Maliseet-Passamaquoddy; the other with a fountain gently spilling water down its faces, complete "Credo". Along the pathways are several interpretive panels telling the story of John Peters Humphrey's life, the story of the artists and their inspiration, the work of the Hampton John Peters Humphrey Foundation, and listing the articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. There is also a donor panel naming the many individuals and groups who that have donated their time and money to make the memorial possible.



Located in the picturesque Kennebecasis Valley overlooking both Darlings Island and Hampton Marsh, this 18-hole course offers a unique challenge to both the experienced and novice golfer. 



is nestled on the Lower Saint John River System, 30 km northeast of the City of Saint John, Canada's first and New Brunswick's largest city. Hampton is a small, friendly community with many points of interest and beautiful natural scenery. The rolling hills, water ways, world renowned marsh area, farmland and wildlife will reward you with a visual feast.

The Town of Hampton, as Shiretown of Kings County, has a rich heritage and culture. It boasts such historical buildings as the Court House, Kings County Goal, Saint Paul's Church and Loyalist Burial Ground and many Heritage Homes.

The Kings County Museum, located in the Centennial Building, is operated by the Kings County Historical and Archival Society. It is open to the public and houses an extensive collection of artifacts related to past life in Kings County and elsewhere. Main exhibits are located in the Centennial Building, with further displays in the Goal next door. The Museum also provides genealogy services for residents and visitors.

Late in 1966, with the approach of the Centennial Year, an agreement was made between the Kings County Historical Society, the Municipality of Kings County, and the New Brunswick Centennial Administration to have space for a Museum in the new County Centennial Building in Hampton. Keys for this facility were given to the Society on September 21, 1966. The official opening of our Museum was held on June 1, 1968.

This part of the Museum consists of four rooms. The main display area has a collection of beautiful crystal, pictures, furniture, guns, a 150-piece bell collection, a broad assortment of textiles ranging from clothing to quilts, and many other items. Two of the Museum's greatest treasures are the "Confederation Conference Quilt" made from the cuttings of dresses worn by



the ladies to the balls and galas of the Confederation Conference in 1964 at Charlottetown, P.E.I., and a print dress worn by an 8-year-old girl who came to Kings County as a Loyalist over 200 years ago.

There are three other rooms including the vault where historical records, over 80 partial genealogies, community histories and other valuable artifacts are kept. This has been named the "Ernest C. G. Graham Room" after one of the Society's Presidents who contributed many hours to historical research. A collection of Royal and Military artifacts are kept in the "Lt. Col. Otty Corbett Room", named after the Society's founding President.

The Kings County Goal is a historic building which was moved from the Kingston, New Brunswick area over the ice, one block at a time and reconstructed in Hampton. It presently houses part of the Kings County Museum. Tours of the building and the museum exhibits are available from June through September.

The Kings County Court House dates back to the early 1870's and still houses the historic and well-preserved county court.

The Kennebecasis River flows through Hampton, and provides an excellent opportunity for boating enthusiasts with an easily accessible public launch. Anglers can enjoy fishing for salmon, striped bass, smallmouth bass, sea-run brook trout, sturgeon, gaspereau, pickerel, perch and eel. Downstream provides access to the Saint John River.

Hampton has four school: Dr. A.T. Leatherbarrow Primary School, Hampton Elementary School, Hampton Middle School, and Hampton High School. Most religious denominations have meeting places in Hampton: Anglican, Baptist, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Pentecostal, Presbyterian, Seventh Day Adventist, Roman Catholic and United.

Hampton boasts two theatres: the Hampton Community Theatre, located in the Hampton High School, and the Leah MacGowan Theatre in the middle school. Both are open to the public for many different forms of entertainment.

The business section of Hampton offers all essential services: restaurants, Bed & Breakfasts, medical, dental and veterinary services, hair styling, banking, vehicle service, pharmacy and wide variety of small businesses. Farm Vacations, Camping (with hookup for RVs, trailers and tenting) are available nearby.

Town services include: police protection (RCMP), volunteer fire, recreational facilities, street lighting, sanitary sewer system, and works department.

The Senior's Resource Centre, located on DeMille Court, serves as a recreation facility for seniors as well as functions such as wedding receptions, card parties and musical events.

The Dr. V.A. Snow Centre is a provincially licensed, accredited facility for seniors needing long term care, and an apartment complex for seniors who are still able to care for themselves.

911 Service is fully implemented in the Hampton area in case of emergencies. There are also a number of family physicians practicing within the town limits.

The Hampton Community Pool is located on Main Street adjacent to the Hampton Arena. It is a Junior Olympic size outdoor pool with attached wading pool, open from the end of May until late August. All staff members are National Life Guard certified. Programs include: swimming lessons for all levels, diving, synchronized swimming, adult lessons, private lessons, public swims, and family swims.

The Vivien Myles Fowler Community Library, housed in the historical Goal Building, is operated by the Hampton Community Club and is staffed by volunteers. Memberships are available free of charge.

Parks and Playgrounds are maintained by the Town of Hampton. The largest of these is the Dutch Point Park (30 acres) which serves as a hiking area, with a network of walking trails laced through the evergreen forest surrounding the park, and into the marshland walkways. Lighthouse park located on Wharf Road, offers a boat ramp facility and a beautiful view. Other parks contain recreational equipment and baseball-softball fields.

The Hampton Community Centre is a major Town facility. It includes an 85' X 185' ice arena during the winter, seating for 400 people, and the Ossekeag Room multi-purpose hall used for meetings, dances, and receptions.

The 18-hole Hampton Golf Club is located off Highway 1 and is open daily from May to October for men's, ladies', and juniors' programs. The Pro shop offers the latest in golf clothing, equipment, and accessories.

The Hampton Curling Club has ice surface for local curling and bonspiels, a recreation area, and bar facilities.











## Hampton Seniors Resource Centre

The Hampton Seniors Resource Centre, located adjacent to the Dr. V. A. Snow Centre, on Logie Drive, was built initially as a resource for seniors, a place where they could spend a few hours during the day visiting in a social atmosphere. This is still the main focus of the Resource Centre, but as with most things, the use of the hall has changed and expanded over the years. It no longer has a full time administrator, but is run by a Board of Directors and volunteers.

Some of the activities held on a regular basis at the Centre include a craft day, where a group meets to quilt and make crafts that are sold as fundraisers for the Centre; the Rotary group holds their weekly meetings at the Centre as well as hosting two dinners throughout the year, the Hampton Hoedowners square dance every Monday evening; Tuesday nights is Bridge; Wednesday nights is cards; and each Thursday during the fall and winter a luncheon is held at noon for those who wish to attend. The luncheon provides a nourishing lunch and a social time and often concludes with a short activity. The lunch is prepared by a group of volunteers and a nominal fee is charged to cover the cost of the food. There is also a regular "Foot Clinic" by the Public Health and Blood Donor clinics held on a regular basis at the Centre.

The Centre is also rented out for use by the public and is used for many, many purposes over the year, such as, wedding receptions, meetings of all kinds, dances and music concerts, along with birthday parties and anniversary parties.

The Resource Centre is handicap accessible and is a bright and large area that suits just about every group and has a large fully equipped kitchen. It can accommodate over 200 people and information regarding rental of and a list of activities can be obtained by calling 832-7871.



#### On your tour of the beautiful Kingston Peninsula make Kingston General Merchants your one-stop shop






## Kingston Farmers Market

The Kingston Farmers Market Co-operative Ltd. was established in 1982 and operated in rented premises in the Kingston Community Hall until it became filled to capacity. In order to expand, the Market became legally incorporated in 1997 as a Co-operative Association, purchased a 3 acre piece of land and constructed a larger building with much help from Peninsula residents, local business enterprises, the Provincial Government and the sale of shares.

The Market operates every Saturday from May to November under the direction of an annually elected unpaid Board of twelve Directors. The Market employs a Market Manager responsible for the renting and allocating of vendor space (currently over 50 places) and a Kitchen Manager and staff who prepare and serve, with the 500 persons each Saturday.

Vendors are independent operators who rent table space by the week, month or season to sell a wide variety of produce and crafts to a clientele



of as many as 1,000 persons. The Market frequently features musical entertainment by buskers, has a traditional annual C u s t o m e r Appreciation Day corn boil, a pumpkin growing contest, and other special Market Day events.

### Aromatic Woods: "...flavor plus, for the backyard grill!"

To add a distinctive flavor to those grilled items this year, try adding aromatic wood chunks or chips to your charcoal, briquettes or gas grill. Chunks may be burned alone or in a combination with coals. Chips are thinner and are most suitable for gas grills Chips and chunks may be presoaked in cold water for 20 minutes, to prolong their burning time; add them when the coals are hot and ready, then wait 5 minutes before beginning to cook. To enhance the intriguing smoked flavors, lower the grill lid for the last few minutes. Most popular and widely available woods:

**Hickory**— reminiscent of bacon is well suited for assertive meats as beef, pork, ribs, turkey, chicken

**Mesquite**—from the scrub tree, subtly enhances the flavor of chicken, lamb all types of fish and ...vegetables too!

Alder—adds a subtle, smoky flavor to steak and fish [particularly good with salmon!!]

**Fruitwoods**—Cherry and Apple are the most widely used and the subtle aromas are good with fish. Use with Poultry, pork and veal, as well as any recipe containing grilled fruit.

**Grapevine twigs and cuttings**—soaked in water, then tossed onto the coals, these give off a subtle, winy, slightly sweet aroma, particularly nice with fish and poultry.

**PS: seaweed!**—washed and dried in the sun, seaweed is a natural flavor enhancer for all manner of seafood

#### RECIPE

Fish-- on the Summer Grill....Caramelized and Smoky! Whole fish may be grilled, using a specially hinged fish grill that aids in turning them easier

#### Grilled Salmon Roast with Pommery-Dill

A whole side of Atlantic salmon cooked as a roast makes a great presentation but individual salmon filets or steaks may also be used, adjusting the grill time to about 5 minutes per side-remove it from the grill before it begins to flake! Steamed Asparagus and toasted spicy pecans would finish off this eastern favorite with a little cool beverage too!

1/4 cup fresh lemon juice // 1/4 cup pommery mustard // 1/4 cup olive oil

3 tablespoons minced shallots or  $1\!\!\!/_2$  cup of minced green onions  $1\!\!\!/_2$  cup chopped fresh dill //  $1\!\!\!/_2$  teaspoon freshly ground pepper //  $1\!\!\!/_2$  teaspoon sea salt

1 cup plain yogurt [probiotic] or sour cream // 1 tablespoon grated lemon zest // whole dill sprigs for garnish

Method

Whisk together the lemon juice, pommery mustard, olive oil, shallots, chopped dill, pepper and sea salt.

Add salmon and turn to coat both sides. Cover and refrigerate at least 1 hour up to 4 hours.

Combine the yogurt and lemon zest.

Prepare a medium fire. Cover and grill the salmon [lightly oil the salmon skin], until browned on the bottom, about 10 minutes. Turn and grill until the fish is opaque, 5-10 minutes longer.

Serve with the dill-lemon-yogurt sauce and suggested finishes. YUM!


