

Teak is Long Term Green Value



If you are looking for an alternative to disposable deck and lawn furniture, consider outdoor furniture made of teak hardwood as a good long-term choice.

The Teak Tree, or Tectona, is a tropical cousin of the birch, and is known for its remarkable resistance to weather, and its ability to flex but not break. Used by shipbuilders since the Middle Ages, teak's dense fibres make it ideal for furnture making because the glue joints will last for a lifetime.

The best-quality furniture is made from teak trees grown on plantations, primarily located in Indonesia and the Philippians.

In a rare ecological win-win, cultivated trees grow straight and fast. Their straight grain makes them better suited to furniture-making than forest-grown trees. The result is a decline in clear-cutting in environmentally sensitive areas.

Teak furniture first became prominent during the Victorian era. Due to its high natural oil content, teak wood is water repellent. Early teak furniture makers recognized these weatherproof advantages and when British sailing ships were decommissioned the teak was salvaged and made into furniture.

Be prepared to take care of your teak. Left alone, teak wood will weather to a mellow silver-grey color, but many people are drawn to its lustre and rich color. To preserve this golden color, count on applying a quality wood sealer about every other year, much as you would apply sealer to your deck.

If you are in the market, you may find that teak furniture is more expensive than the products you find at home centers and department stores. But if you are tired of replacing your patio furniture every year or so, the purchase of teak furniture may actually save you money over the years.

Hot Tubs: Tips For Safe Soaking

(NC)—Hot tubs are a great way to relax, renew your spirits and escape from your cares and worries. However, there are certain precautions you should take to ensure that your hot tub experience is a safe one.

First, check the water temperature before entering the hot tub. It should be at a maximum of 40° C (104° F). You should also limit the amount of time you spend in the water to 10 - 15 minute intervals with cool down periods in between to avoid becoming overheated.

Never allow children to use a hot tub without adult supervision and maintain constant eye contact with children when they are around a spa or hot tub.

Never use a hot tub while under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs such as antihistamines, tranquilizers or anticoagulants that may cause drowsiness or increase/decrease blood temperature.

Consult with your doctor before using a hot tub if you have heart disease, high or low blood pressure, are pregnant, or have any serious illness.

Make sure the entry and exit areas around the hot tub are slip-resistant and have good deck drainage and remove any vegetation or other obstacles that can impede your view of the hot tub or spa.

Keep toys stored away that could encourage a child to enter the water. Do not allow horseplay or roughhousing around a spa or hot tub that can lead to slips, falls or injury.

Never use a spa or hot tub with a drain cover or grate that is loose or broken and make sure the hot tub is protected by a rigid safety cover that locks shut to prevent unauthorized use.

Installing a permanent fence in your backyard is essential in preventing children, pets and unauthorized users from entering your property and using your hot tub. Sliding glass doors and other entrances to the hot tub area should also have self-closing, self-latching mechanisms.

Find The Perfect Pool To Suit Your Needs

(NC)—A swimming pool is the perfect way to entertain the kids and spend quality time with your family or just to relax and enjoy the outdoors. But before you head out the door to your local pool store, take the time to learn about the different types of pools available. Here is an overview of what you can choose for your backyard.

Vinyl-lined pools are the most popular type of pool in Canada. Constructed of steel walled panels supported by steel braces, this type of pool features a vinyl liner placed over the steel panels and the pool floor and is held in place by coping around the pool perimeter.



Poured-in-place concrete pools use concrete that is poured over a rebar grid (steel rods for reinforcement) between prepared forms, while wet mix shotcrete uses pre-mixed concrete that is sprayed onto a steel reinforced grid through a hose nozzle. The walls of the pool are then finished in plaster or other coating products and then painted and decorated with tile or stone accents. Concrete pools are more labour-intensive than vinyllined pools and can take several weeks to build - but they do offer unlimited design potential. Another option is a fiberglass


pool. This type of pool is prefabricated and is shipped to the site on a trailer and lowered into the ground by a crane. The fiberglass shell is then plumbed and backfilled, with installation taking about one week.

The most affordable of all pool types is the above-ground pool, which consists of a vinyl liner attached to an above-ground metal or resin frame in a round or oval shape. Above-ground pools average 1.2m - 1.3m (4 - 4.5 ft.) in height and offer contemporary colours and accents on the outside walls and uprights that allow them to complement any home or landscaping design.

Onground pools – also called semi-inground pools – are made of rigid steel or aluminum walls that are partially lowered into the ground. Ideal for backyards with uneven terrain, onground pools are also perfect for yards with limited space and come in round and oval shapes.

What You Should Know Before Purchasing A Garage Door

(NC)—A garage door is an important component to any home. It represents much of a home's façade and is your home's largest piece of moving equipment. But you know little about garage doors. How are you going to choose a door and have it installed to your satisfaction? We contacted J-F Morin, marketing director at Garaga Inc. (www.gara-

ga.com) to learn more. Keep reading below to find out the three most important things you need to know.

No. 1: What kind of door should I buy?

Garage doors are typically made of three different types of materials: metal (steel or aluminum), wood or vinyl. • Metal (steel /aluminum) garage doors are among the most popular today (80% of the Canadian market).The cost of a steel door is lower than a door made of any other material. Aluminum is mostly chosen for its weight. They may be ordered in many colours. Both are insulated and require very little maintenance.

• Wood garage doors have been around for the longest period of time. Wood has a natural beauty and is versatile. It may be painted or stained. The quality of a wood door varies from wood composite to solid wood construction. They are available in a very wide price range. The more you pay, the better the quality.

• Other materials such as vinyl or fiberglass. Vinyl garage doors are completely maintenance free. They are scratch resistant. While the initial cost of a vinyl door is greater than doors made of other materials, the long-term cost is lower.



No. 2: What company should I buy from?

Unfortunately, the garage door industry in Canada is not strictly monitored, J-F Morin says. There are many fly-by-night companies that are not insured and do not provide their employees with workers' compensation. You want to look for a company that:

• is professional and courteous;

• supplies references from previous customers upon request;

• provides their technicians with uniforms and clean trucks;

• carries adequate insurance.

No. 3: Where do I purchase a garage door?


There are three types of retailers to choose from when purchasing a garage door: mega home-supply stores, door and window dealers, and garage door specialists. J-F Morin strongly suggests dealing with a reputable garage door specialist. This company will send a sales representative to your home and/or may have a showroom that you and your family can visit so that you can see exactly what you are buying. These companies employ their own installers and technicians and will guar-

antee materials and labour. Their motto is "Quality work time after time!"

In the end, if you remember just one thing, according to Mr. Morin, it should be that a garage door's performance and long-term durability depend as much on the quality of the installation as on the quality of the product itself. - News Canada

FIREPLACE OPTIONS FOR THE NEW HOME BUILDER OR RENOVATOR

A fireplace can be a wonderful addition to a family room, a den, a bedroom or even a kitchen. It will add beauty and elegance to the living space and will provide a lovely atmosphere and ambiance to the room when in use. The heating options are wood, pellet, propane, natural gas or electric. But that is only the start. You then can choose from different door finishes (gold, nickel, metallic black, etc), and different surround trims. You can even opt for a bay window. And finally you can choose from a variety of mantels (cast, wood or stone) to add that final touch of elegance. And do not forget that electric fireplaces have the advantage of being portable. All that is needed is a 120 volt outlet.

A lot of home builders are installing wood burning fireplaces to supplement heat throughout their entire home. This trend could be due to concerns over energy costs or simply a desire to be safe and secure during power outages. In these situations heat is transferred to different zones in the home by ducting the fireplace into the furnace plenum for distribution through the central heating system's ductwork. In other cases homeowners are using ducts to get heat into an adjoining room or two. Ducting can go in any direction, including down to the level below the fireplace!

A popular trend, for homeowners designing large family rooms, living rooms or dens, is to install a gas fireplace with flames that can reach as high as 18 to 20 inches (normal height is 4 to 6 inches). This of course is necessary to ensure that the flame is in proportion to the size of the living space. With numerous options available



such as different mantels, firebox liners, log designs and flame patterns, new homeowner's have complete control over the look of their fireplace.

For the homeowner that is looking for an entirely different look there are now propane and natural gas fireplace wall units and corner units. And for a contemporary look you now have flames that rise over smooth river rock or tumbled glass.

 Use natural materials in warm colours wherever you can. Wood or warm tile floors and granite sinks and faucets add instant warmth. 
• Cabinetry pulls in matte versus shiny finishes also warm up the room, even if the hardware is a metal. Rather than a shiny metal select from bronze, wood or matte metal finishes.

• Keeping walls painted in a light colour and windows uncovered so that lots of warm natural light pours into the room, will help keep everyone feeling warm and comforted in the kitchen.

• Finally, comfortable and casual seating is conducive to conversation and a great way to encourage late night chats with otherwise uncommunicative teenagers. Use wood or warm colours for seating and tables and cushioned seats. Casual bar seating is ideal instead of more formal table seating which should be reserved for the formal dining area.

With just a few changes to add warmth and comfort to your kitchen, you may find more happy memories created at the kitchen counter than in front of the electronics in the family room. Another good reason to keep things warm in the kitchen.

Kitchen Reno...From Heaven Or Hell? 5 Step Plan To A Smooth Kitchen Renovation.

For a kitchen renovation you have probably all heard of the stories about cost overruns, delays & general nightmares. In reality most go very well especially if you do a bit of preplanning. Following are five steps to make the process go smoothly:

#1--You need a plan

Help With Buying Your First Home

(NC)—Looking for a down payment for your mortgage? You may already have it stashed away in your retirement savings! The Government of Canada's Home Buyers' Plan may allow you to withdraw up to \$20,000 from your Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) to buy or build a qualifying home. Do you qualify? If neither you nor your spouse or common-law partner owned a home that you lived in as your principal place of residence at any time in the four calendar years before the year of your RRSP withdrawal, and ending 31 days before your withdrawal, then you may be able to participate in the Home Buyers' Plan. You may also qualify if you or a relative is disabled and you are buying a more accessible home for yourself or your relative.

Are you buying a home with your spouse, common-law partner, or someone else? You can each withdraw up to \$20,000 from your RRSP, provided that each person is able to participate in the Home Buyers' Plan. The amount you withdraw will have to be repaid to your RRSP. You must begin to make repayments in the second year following the year you made your withdrawal and you have up to 15 years to repay the total amount.





• Ensure the contractor is registered with the provincial Worker's Compensation Board or similar organization: if an injury or damage occurs during the completion of work activities on a homeowners' property, the homeowner could be held liable and often, homeowner's insurance does not cover this type of accident.


What Makes Them "Safety" Glasses?

Resistance to impact is the main difference between safety glasses and regular glasses, which often look just like them. Standards for safety glasses requires them to withstand the impact of a quarter inch steel ball traveling 150 feet per second. You can't depend on your prescription glasses for this kind of protection.

It is important to remember that standard safety glasses protect against impact from the front only.

Care and Use

Your safety glasses are designed to protect you from accidental injury. They will not withstand repeated impact or abuse, however. Inspect them regularly for scratches, cracks or other wear and replace them if the are scratched, bent or uncomfortable. Scratches not only interfere with your ability to see what you're doing - a hazard in itself; they can also weaken the structure of the lens and its resistance to impact. Taking care of your glasses and, above all, using them, will help you "look" your best on the job.

How To Maintain A Great Looking Landscape

There are several key components to looking after your property which should be scheduled each year as part of your outdoor "to do" list. By looking after a few key maintenance jobs on a routine basis, your property will look well cared for, and still leave you time for some summer R&R.

Spring Dethatching & Bed Cleanup: To give the tiny new blades of grass the best possible environment to grow in, a dethatching or raking should be done once the ground dries up from the winter snowmelt. This raking will rid the lawn of much of the old, dead thatch which can be a breeding ground for disease and insect activity. The shrub beds and gardens should be cleaned up in the Spring too, for both aesthetic and health reasons. Decomposing leaves from last year's perennials should be cut as low as possible so there is ample room for new growth.

Aeration: Spring is a great time for aeration. This procedure pulls small cores of soil out of the ground to loosen the soil, thus allowing more airflow for the smaller roots of the grass to develop. Ideally, a lawn would be aerated each spring so that the lawn gets off to a good start in the high growth period of the season. By the time the dethatching and aeration is done, you should be on schedule to begin your mowing for the season. Try to mow routinely once per week so that the lawn does not get too long before it is cut. It is best to cut only 1/3 of the blade off at any given time.

Shrub Pruning: Pruning of most shrubs can be done at any time of the season, but mid season seems to provide the best results for the least amount of effort. By waiting to prune until the plant has finished its big growth spurt in the Spring, it will then keep its shape for the majority of the remaining season. By looking after pruning shrubs and hedges each



year, the predicament of how to prune an overgrown shrub or hedge is avoided.

Weeding and Mulching: Adding mulch to your garden areas serves several functions. Not only will the gardens have a finished, manicured look, but the mulch serves as a great moisture retention vehicle for the plant roots. As well, mulch can serve as a weed deterrent. Fewer small weeds are able to take hold and develop, so the overall weeding issue is diminished. Keep on top of whatever weeds do develop by scheduling a weeding session once a week; or, if you have many gardens, perhaps you rotate around the property on a routine basis, looking after one or two beds each week so none get completely out of control!

Fertilization: Even though the grass is green in the Spring, there are certain nutrients and microorganisms in the soil which become depleted over time and, without replenishment, quickly lead to a health decline in the lawn. Weed activity will begin to overtake weaker lawn areas and more aggressive lawn care or lawn renovation procedures will need to be introduced. Instead, routinely apply an organic or organic-based fertilizer so that as many micronutrients and natural organisms can be present to develop a healthy soil environment. Fertilizer should be applied approximately every 4 to 6 weeks, and don't forget to keep the soil's pH in balance with a lime application at some point in the season.

Fall CleanUp and Shrub Protection: Before getting caught up in Christmas preparations, do one final round of maintenance work in the yard. In the late Fall, rake up as many leaves as possible from the lawn to avoid encouraging disease and fungus activity on the lawn. Also, erect shrub protection (stakes and burlap) just before the ground freezes around those shrubs that are somewhat borderline in hardiness or are in a harsh windy location.

By following these guidelines, you will be able to maintain a property to be proud of for many years.

Canadian Homeowners Get Paid To Go Green

(NC)—Canadian homeowners will be big winners now that the Federal Government has officially launched its ecoENERGY Retrofit initiative, offering financial incentives to Canadians who improve their home's energy efficiency.

Natural Resources of Canada (NRCan) has licensed AmeriSpec Inspection Services, Canada's leading home inspection company, to perform residential energy evaluations that identify how homes use



energy and where it is being wasted. AmeriSpec evaluators will show homeowners how to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, reduce heating and cooling costs and improve comfort in their homes, while ensuring adequate ventilation for a healthy indoor environment.

To take advantage of the program, homeowners first must complete an assessment by a licensed energy evaluator who will determine the home's current energy rating. The service includes: a detailed energy

evaluation of the home, a blower door test to find air leaks, a printed report that shows where energy dollars are being spent, recommendations on what homeowners can do to improve their home's energy efficiency and an energy efficiency rating label that shows how efficient their home is compared to other homes in their region. 



What Is A Home Inspection?

If you are putting your house on the market, an inspection helps hasten the sale and can generate a higher price. A home inspection is a thorough visual examination of the home and property.

The process usually takes two to three hours, during which time the house is examined from the ground up. The inspection includes observation and, when appropriate, operation of the plumbing, heating, air conditioning, electrical, and appliance systems, as well as structural components: roof, foundation, basement, exterior and interior walls, chimney, doors, and windows.

When conducted by a professional, a home inspection covers about 1,000 check-points in approximately 400 items around the home. Findings should be provided to you in the form of a comprehensive report. It is vital that such a report include an objective evaluation of the condition of the home, clearly relating existing defects and indicating potential problems.

A home inspection report is not a warranty.

Because a home inspection is a visual examination of the home and operating systems, it is not technically exhaustive. There is no assurance, expressed or implied, that equipment will not break down at some future date. However, such protection is available when a home inspection is complemented by a home warranty. When the services are used in conjunction with one another, a home warranty covers the items that were serviceable at the time of the inspection and subsequently fail due to normal wear and tear.

A home inspection does not detect every conceivable flaw. It is an inspection of those areas and items that can be seen. Home inspectors cannot see through foundation, floors or walls, and cannot inspect areas or items that are inaccessible.

Helpful Hints To Make Your Hardwood Floor Last A Lifetime

(NC)—You finally have the beautiful hardwood flooring you've been longing for. So now what? Here are some quick maintenance tips to ensure your floor stands the test of time.

Be mindful of when to install your floor.

Acclimatization of your new hardwood floor depends on the climate and moisture conditions in which it is being installed. Be sure to check the manufacturer's recommendations.

Always use a hardwood flooring cleaner that is recommended by the manufacturer.

NEVER wash your hardwood floors with water. Wood and water don't mix.

Mind the furniture.

There is no such thing as a scratch-proof floor. Make sure you apply felt pads under all furniture and chair legs.

Invest in a de-humidifier/humidifier.

Hardwood flooring is a living material, so it will expand and contract with changes in seasons. Wood floors will expand during the humid summer months, so the use of a dehumidifier is recommended. 


